Major Metro Award-TIE Triangle J Council of Governments Jordan Lake Partnership & Triangle Regional Water Supply Plan

The Triangle J Council of Governments (TJCOG) worked with 13 local governments and public bodies that voluntarily joined together to form the Jordan Lake Partnership and create the **Triangle Regional Water Supply Plan**. Partnership members committed themselves to address the short- and long-term water supply needs of each city and the region as a whole. Created in 2009, following eight years of historic droughts, the Partnership came together to make water allocation decisions that improve the reliability and resiliency of their water supplies through a cooperative agreement. In doing so, a plan has been put in place to ensure that each municipality will have the water it needs to maintain current needs and meet future needs.
